

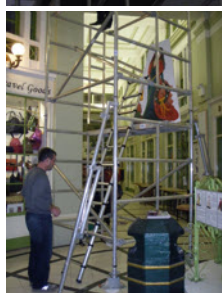
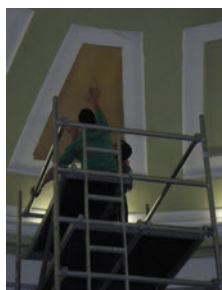

Rotunda Images Installation and Celebration



Historic Ryde Society is delighted to announce the successful completion of our first community project. The installation of the rotunda images was completed on January 13, 2011. We are indebted to Andy and Adam of Warrens Display Ltd, who installed the images free of charge. At the celebration on January 27th - a bitterly cold evening! - the 100-strong crowd heard chairman, Wayne Jones state that this was a community project in all ways - done by the community, paid for by the community to be enjoyed by the community. There has been much media interest in the paintings and they have been greatly admired. Ryde District Heritage Centre

Work to create a heritage centre in the basement of the Royal Victoria Arcade began in mid-February. Wight Construction won the contract to do the work, made possible by a generous grant from Ryde Townscape Heritage Initiative. Historic Ryde Society is indebted to Lee Byrne and Mr Cartwright, the owner of the Arcade, who are both very enthusiastic about the plans for the centre. Work is progressing rapidly, the walls have been plastered, a new floor has been installed, and a toilet facility has been increased in size. HRS is very lucky to have the services of Andrew and Beth Laitt, of Depth Ltd, as architects.

The image on the right shows the basement as it was when the builders doing the arcade renovation moved out. The lower pictures show



some of the work being done to make the fabric of the building secure, in order to create a wonderful space for the heritage centre.



HRS AGM and Brannon Talk

Over 40 members and friends attended the first AGM of Historic Ryde Society. The audience were given an update on the 'state of play' regarding funds, membership and the plans for the arcade basement, and our Royal Victorian Ryde event over the first weekend of July. We were then delighted to be given a fascinating talk and slide show by Ken Hicks, about the Brannon family, engravers and founders of the Isle of Wight County Press. Ken brought along some of his collection, not all Brannons, which included a lovely early engraving of the garden of Westfield House, in Spencer Road. Many members took the opportunity to renew their subscriptions, and the raffle raised £59.

Bicentennial of Ryde Pier

An original copy of Ryde Pier Act, dated July 13, 1812, was very kindly lent to the society by Ken Hicks. Ken agreed that we could photograph the Act, which Claire did (very efficiently!) and it has been photoshopped and printed out on A4, which has worked beautifully.

After 30 pages, there are three showing the rates levied for landing various items on the pier. The image below shows the second of these pages with a selection of items available, and how they were quantified. It makes for interesting reading!

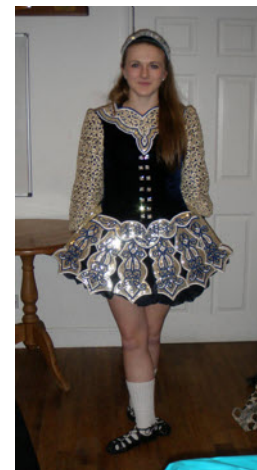
St Patrick's Ceilidh Evening

The RVYC was originally based on Ryde Pier, before a new clubhouse, now the Prince Consort, was built in 1846, the foundation stone being laid by Prince Albert, on March 2nd.



The RVYC moved to Fishbourne in 1965, and we are very grateful to them for allowing us to hold our first ceilidh evening in the clubhouse. Hopefully, the first of many events there!

Nearly 100 turned up for the event, and several people came to chat and indicated they will join the society over the next few days, so it was a great opportunity to spread the word and gain new members.
