The extension opened last July by HRH The Duke of Gloucester, is now fully established and has four distinct identities: the Commercial Room, the Office, the Flightpath and the School-room.

The Commercial Room has exhibits relating to chemists, mineral water manufacturers and brewers of Ryde, as well as photographs of shops long gone, including The Doll's House, in the Upper High Street.

The Office is a small useful space, which has become a dedicated storage area.

In the Flightpath are displays relating to Ryde Airport and the development of the hovercraft. Video footage of both subjects has been donated by Christopher Balfour and Barrie Jehan respectively. These films can be viewed on the screen in this room. Christopher has also donated the wooden sign which used to stand on the taxi rank on Ryde Esplanade to advertise the airport. The School-room has information about the development of education in Ryde, since the establishment of the First National School in Melville Street in 1812. Many school photographs have been donated to the Centre, which are on display. The phoenix from Swanmore Middle School has been given a new home here. The room also contains an area for temporary exhibitions, and has been used since the end of 2012 as an opportunity for local artists to display their work. HRS founder member Lynne Gregory-Phillips and HRS member Martie Cain have exhibited in this area and both have sold a painting, 10% of the sale being donated to Ryde District Heritage Centre.


A further extension of the Heritage Centre is about to start, with the opening of the rotunda basement, the ice well and the adjoining room. This is likely to take several months, as we continue to raise funds for the project. Historic Ryde Society would like to pay tribute to HRS member Terry Manley, who passed away in February. A keen volunteer, eager to muck in with anything asked of him, Terry is sorely missed.





During the clearing of the ice well, many artefacts made of wood and metal were brought to the surface. It is hoped to clean these over time and incorporate in the display, as they are part of the history of the building. HRS member and volunteer Jerry Bryett has taken advantage of the bad weather to come along and clear rubbish and bricks from this area and has taken it upon himself to scrub the floor, removing sixty years of accumulated dirt. A worthwhile task, as the flagstones have cleaned up beautifully, and, although there's several months to go, there's an inkling of how well the area will look once finished. An old tar boiler with associated tools has also been found. This was used by the current owner's father, Mr Cartwright, when he saved the building from demolition in the early 1970s.





The images show the tar boiler, containing jugs and a bucket, and another old bucket with a very large ladle, recently uncovered in the basement of the arcade. Anyone fancy cleaning duty?



From the left, the images show the build up of over 100 bags of silt removed from the well before being taken to the dump. The third image shows half of the cleaning work done, and the fourth the floor as it is at present. Interesting features in this passage are a round basin at the far right, as yet unidentified, an inverted arch on the lower step - any ideas? - and the sloping course of flagstones abutting the left hand wall of the passage, presumably to aid drainage. This area has been earmarked for a display about the 19th century International Ice Trade, which began in 1833.

As well as metal work and wooden artefacts, these Randalls of Ryde bottles and Victorian cream jars were recovered from the silt in the well. They are now on display in the Heritage Centre. Once the other items have been cleaned and conserved, the ice well display will contain as many of the finds as possible, to enhance the history of the Royal Victoria Arcade.



As we go to press, HRS committee has just been informed that our latest Heritage Lottery fund application has been unsuccessful. This means that all fund-raising efforts need to bring in a lot more money, to ensure the highest possible standard for the extension of the Centre. If anyone has any wonderful ideas, contacts in the corporate world - anything at all regarding fundraising the committee would love to hear from you!

The recent decision to raise the admission charge to the Centre from  $\pounds 1$  to  $\pounds 2$  appears to be going well. The first couple gave  $\pounds 5$  without complaint, asking for the extra pound to be put in the donation box.

The first coffee morning to be held in the Heritage Centre was a great success, and two of the members of Bridget's Group became members of Historic Ryde Society on the day.
