In less than eight weeks, The Far Side has been delivered with 20 minutes to spare before the first Royal visit to Ryde District Heritage Centre!

Thanks to sterling work by a small band of volunteers, some of whom worked in the basement until at least midnight three nights in a row prior to the visit, Historic Ryde Society was able to welcome HRH Prince Richard, Duke of Gloucester, to Ryde District Heritage Centre on Tuesday, July 3, 2012.

One day the previous week, no fewer than 15 volunteers arrived, ranging in age from 16 to 81, both of whom spent a few hours on their hands and knees, scraping many years of paint off the floor. The experience was quite humbling, and we are all very grateful for everyone's help.





The Duke walked through the avenue of the arcade, and was told about the Royal photographers who had studios here. The rotunda images were pointed out, before going round to view the proposed Ryde crescent image at the entrance to the Heritage Centre. Several invited guests were then introduced to His Royal Highness, who was shown around the Centre by architect Andrew Laitt, and HRS secretary, Diana Wood. The Duke showed particular interest in the arcade porters' cap badge, on loan from IW Heritage Service, the photographs, both old and new, the Ryde Airport display, and plans for the Flightpath, where the airport display will share a space with the hovercraft material.

The Duke remained in the arcade for nearly an hour, during which time he was introduced to Rhea Campbell-Smith, who played the part of Young Victoria in the Royal Victorian Ryde event of 2011. Rhea offered the Duke a chocolate covered strawberry, which he enjoyed so much, he had another! Following a tour of the Heritage Centre, the Duke unveiled a plaque in the rotunda of the Royal Victoria Arcade heralding the official opening of Ryde District Heritage Centre. On Wednesday, June 27, a special event took place in Ryde District Heritage Centre. Christopher Balfour, whose father founded Ryde Airport, met Archie Faithfull, whose father sold the land for the airport, to Christopher's father. The 27th marked the 80th anniversary of the Spithead Express Service, between Ryde and Portsmouth. This meeting was orchestrated by Bob Wealthy, of Solent Aeromarine Ltd, who first alerted HRS to the anniversary. The meeting was recorded by Jonathan Skeet and Claire Kay, and the interview will be available to listen to in the Heritage Centre in due course. Part of the newly refurbished area of the centre has been set aside for a joint display of Ryde Airport and Hovercraft material. This area has been nicknamed The Flightpath.





A busy month for fundraising, July events begin with an Antique and Collectors' Fair on Sunday, July 8. This will take place in the Masonic Hall, John Street, from 10;00 until 3:30, admission 75p.
