# The road to the Queen's Award...





**Out to the undiscovered ends...** When Historic Ryde Society launched its HLF project in July 2011, there was little to suggest that less than four years on, the volunteers would win The Queen's Award for Voluntary Service 2015.

A Ryde Townscape Heritage Initiative grant of £30,000 created the blank canvas. Ryde District Heritage Centre was then established, following a successful application to the Heritage Lottery Fund, with a grant of £49,300 being made on April 19, 2011. A nerve-wracking few weeks! Thanks to IW Council Conservation Officer Lee Byrne, architect Andrew Laitt of Depth Ltd., and HLF officers Emily and Chrissie for their support and advice throughout.







The launch was the culmination of nearly three years of work behind the scenes. Diana presented her talk - 'The Lives and Times of the Royal Victoria Arcade' at Ryde Arts Festival 2009, attracting an audience of 60. She also had a small display in the rotunda of the arcade.

Having met Tony at Ryde History Week in May 2009, and knowing that Liz and Lynne were keen amateur actors, ideas began to form, and in July of that year the first small group met to discuss arrangements for the launch celebration, in 2011. Historic Ryde Society formed in October 2009.

Through further discussions, it was decided to try and establish a Heritage Centre in Ryde, and after considering shop units, and St Thomas' Church, the basement of The Royal Victoria Arcade came into play.







Lynne was in charge of the rotunda images project. Twelve local artists were commissioned to create images of the months of the year, following a contemporary engraving of circa 1840, showing the avenue of the arcade, with a central fountain feature.



The hugely successful photoboards were also made ready for the launch, and to date have brought in nearly £2500!

Since opening on August 15, 2011, HRS volunteers have clocked up around 20,000 hours' work, and welcomed nearly 13,000 visitors to the Centre.

Fundraising is a relentless task, and more volunteers are always welcome! Overheads are around £15,000 annually.









As well as talks and monthly quizzes, Historic Ryde Society welcomes group visits to the Heritage Centre, and has a handling collection and Powerpoint presentations which can be offered to other groups on the Island. Several 'memory trips' have been delivered to residential homes in and around Ryde, and oral history interviews made.
